

COMMON COUNCIL

January 12, 2015

The Common Council of the City of Wabash met in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, Monday, January 12, 2015, in regular session. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Vanlandingham who presided, and the Pledge of Allegiance was given in unison.

City Attorney Doug Lehman gave the prayer.

The roll was answered by 6 members. Council Member Long was absent.

The minutes of the meeting held December 8, 2014 were approved as circulated. Council Member Salb made a motion to accept the minutes. Council Member Haag seconded the motion. On call of the roll the vote was as follows:
