PRESS RELEASE

The City of Wabash would like to provide an update to the citizens concerning upcoming road pavement projects.

- Friday, July 12th, Stitt Street between Cass Street and Wabash Street will be milled for repaving. Paving will occur the week of July 15th.
- *Monday, July 15th, South Wabash Street will be milled for repaving, with paving beginning thereafter.*
- The City will close Smith Street at Miami/Wabash Street during paving. Access to businesses on Smith Street (Riverfront Sweets/Welding Services/ Poole Foods) between Cass and Wabash Street will be via Cass Street.
- *There will be temporary closures of S. Wabash Street at times during paving. Flaggers will be in place to direct traffic to either the Huntington Street Bridge or Carroll Street Bridge, during the period of paving in the intersection of Wabash/Miami/Smith Streets when the time comes. Business access on S. Wabash Street during paving will be restricted **temporarily**.*
- Norfolk Southern Railroad has advised the City of Wabash that they will be closing Wabash Street, Allen Street, Spring Street, and East Street beginning Monday July 15th for crossing replacement. This will mean that SR13 will be detoured to SR15 through the City. **SR 15 to Fulton Street to Miami Street and south to the Wabash Street Bridge will be the preferred detour route due to the milling and paving on S. Wabash Street.**
- *Alber Street on the north side of the City is scheduled to be completed and reopen to traffic by July 24th.*

While this will create an inconvenience, the paving projects should be completed by the middle of the following week (July 22nd-26th). Once Wabash Street paving is completed, the City of Wabash will mill and pave Miami Street from the Wabash/Smith Street intersection to just north of Water Street at the railroad spur crossing in the upcoming weeks.
